Mary Ellen Foley said that she received a complaint to a dog park pass holder, that a couple have been seen a few times jumping the fence and throwing the dog over the fence on the 10th street side

Rich Brodman, 4 East 10th Street, announced the last general meeting of the Taxpayers' Association this Saturday. The speakers will be Mark Pojednic, Captain of First Aid Squad and Mayor Larson. He said that a beach cleanup was being planned for October 22nd and all are invited to participate. Dr. Brodman said that if we wanted to get in touch with the owners of the kayaks, it would be in the first two weeks of April. He said it was popular for people put the kayaks in and just leave them there.

Mayor Larson said that there was a townwide picnic, sponsored by the Republican Club, coming up on September 24th at 5:00pm at the pavilion.

Sponge Washburn, said that there was an EOC meeting today. He said that we were half way through hurricane season and not to let your guard down. He urged everyone to be prepared, have supplies ready and an evacuation plan ready. He also said that the Health Department has the booster vaccine and you can sign up online. He said that the flu vaccines will be available on September 27th at St. Francis.

Allan Canter, 1 West 29th Street, thanked the DPW for the repairs on 29th Street due to the damage that was caused by the garbage truck. He said they did a great job.
