REGULAR MEETING OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL April 13, 2022

THE CAUCUS MEETING of the Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor Larson at 4:30pm at the at the Barnegat Light Borough Hall, 10 East 7th Street, Barnegat Light, NJ. He stated that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act. Notice of this meeting was posted on the bulletin board in Borough Hall and was advertised in the Asbury Park Press on January 24, 2022.

ROLL CALL: Spark, Wellington, Alloway, absent, Reynolds, Foley, and Mikuletzky

Also present: Mayor Larson, Terry Brady, Sponge Washburn, and Brenda Kuhn

Discussion: Mayor Larson said that the Easter Egg Hunt will be held on Saturday. The next topic was zoning issues, specifically the difficulty with pools and pool companies. Sponge said that they give the pool companies 15 days for dewatering and they normally comply with that but the problem is that they leave and don't come back for six months and then they have to dewater again. He said some people are putting in "martini pools" which are smaller than a bathtub. He attributed the influx of pool installations to the ability to increase rental rates Sponge recommended that the Borough work on an ordinance for the percentage of lot coverage and/or setbacks, which would eliminate the number of pools permits. He mentioned Beach Haven changing the amount of impervious coverage. He said that we didn't have this in our code. Councilman Wellington suggested in addition of the 15-day dewatering, adding a 45-day limit on the construction of the pool. Other things associated with pools are noise and lighting at night. Sponge talked about ticket books for violations. With the ticket book, the violated would go to court and have the right to contest it. He said there was a problem with that because it has to be written to an individual not a

company and they don't have that. He talked about creating fines associated with various violations. With this method a "stop work order" could be issued and work could not begin until the fine was paid. Other zoning fees were also discussed, Sponge has a spreadsheet of suggested fees. Mayor Larson said that we could have this ready for introduction for next month. Sponge said that some towns have their own police department and all of these fines are done by the police.

Mayor Larson asked for a motion to close the Caucus. On a motion by Reynolds, seconded by Spark and carried by all the Caucus Meeting was closed.

ORDINANCE 2022-04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARNEGAT LIGHT, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING SECTION 144-4.1 OF THE BOROUGH CODE, ENTITLED "LIFEGUARD-IN-TRAINING PROGRAM."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barnegat Light, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 144-4.1 of Chapter 144 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Barnegat Light, entitled "Lifeguard-in-Training Program," is hereby amended and supplemented to provide as follows: CHAPTER 144

RECREATION AND PUBLIC RESORT AREAS

Article I

Beaches§ 144-4.1. Lifeguard-in-Training Program.

- A. There shall be a lifeguard-in-training program during the regular summer beach season.
- B. The program shall be open to a limited number of applicants between 10 and 15 years of age.
- C. The dates and length of the program shall be determined by the lifeguards with consent of the Borough Council Beaches and Parks Committee.
- D. A swimming test shall be completed by each applicant prior to acceptance into the program.
- E. Clothing shall be provided by the Borough to each applicant that is approved for the program.
- F. The fee for participation in the lifeguard-in-training program shall be \$125.
- **SECTION 2.** All ordinances of parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after second reading and publication as required by law.
