PUBLIC SAFETY: Councilman Mikuletzky reported as follows:

- Requested to make the Court Report part of the meeting minutes
- Reported on the Court collections and how it was distributed

BEACHES AND PARKS: Councilwoman Reynolds reported as follows:

- 2023 beach badge total sales were \$283,535, up from previous year.
- Pickleball revenue was \$9,325 in 2023
- Dog park 2023 revenue was \$8,670 which was down slightly from 2022
- Now have small dog park
- Now is the time to renew dog licenses and paw passes
- Asked Hock for proposal for beach walkways

DOCKS AND HARBORS: Councilman Gutowski reported as follows:

- Revenue for docks & harbors was up by \$25,000 in 2023, mostly from slips
- Currently 3 slips available-Kathy going through wait list to fill
- Met with Mayor and Superintendent
- Will have a committee meeting

PUBLIC WORKS: Councilman Wellington reported as follows:

- Storms created a lot of damage to the beaches-worked on cleaning up
- Batting cage completed
- All Christmas lights down
- Installed new playground equipment at bay beach
- Abandoned kayaks put away
- General town maintenance

FINANCE: Councilman Spark reported as follows:

- Bills were paid in the amount of \$474,600
- Regional school tax \$135,800/LBI school tax \$114,000

WATER/SEWER: Councilman Spark reported on behalf of Councilwoman Foley:

- Stuart is working with Long Beach Township to install a new meter for High Bar Harbor
- Should be done within the next couple of months

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION: Mayor Larson asked for a motion to open the open public session.

Tim Brindley, 1404 Bayview Avenue, asked if there was access to the batting cage from outside of the park and the response was yes.

Councilwoman Reynolds started reading a text from James Murtaugh, 13 West 5th Street regarding the beach walkways. The mayor said that he should attend a meeting or send a letter because it was correspondence.

Tracey Cameron, 13 W 5th Street, said she was considering forming an advisory committee regarding the beach walkways.

Councilman Wellington said that he didn't know what an advisory committee would do. He said they make a couple of mistakes and has apologized for them. He said that things will grow back by spring and the DPW will be able to maintain with lawnmowers and weed wackers. He also addressed hiring a contractor to maintain the beach walkways as Councilwoman Reynolds has suggested. He said that we have a legally binding union contract with the teamsters and you cannot take work away from union workers. So, hiring a contractors would have to be negotiated with the union.

Bruce Allen, 1405 Seaview Avenue, asked if Harvey Cedars was willing and able to bid on our Police Contract. Mayor Larson said that they have been asked and they do not want to increase their police force. Councilman Mikuletzky said that Long Beach Township police have to come this way because of High Bar Harbor.

Allan Cantor, "mayor of 29th street", addressed Councilwoman Reynolds regarding online beach badge sales. He said check the internet because there are lots of companies out there. Then he addressed Councilman Gutowski. He said he would be happy to share his notes regarding the kayak area.

George Benedict, The White Whale, said that he did not have a problem with the parking on 7th Street but some of the neighbors did. Councilman Spark said that the problem was a safety issue.

John Alchus, 8 West 7th Street, said he didn't understand about the parking on 7th Street. He was told

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Barnegat Light, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, that the Mayor and Municipal Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a Shared Services Agreement with the Township of Long Beach for Police Services, a copy of which is attached hereto, in accordance with the provision of the law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect January 1, 2024.
