Trucks start their routes early- please place all items out for pick-up the night before or by 6:00AM on the day of pick-up



- Trash is picked up on Mondays & Thursdays (\*except as noted)
- Racks should be no higher than 18" on the street side. <u>ALL</u> cans <u>MUST</u> have lids & cannot be larger than 32 gallons (no toters)

## RECYCLING (R)

#### \*NO Plastic Bags in Recycling!\*

- ➤ All cans <u>MUST</u> have lids & holes in the bottom for drainage
- ➤ All cans <u>MUST</u> have stickers on the side & lid- stickers available at Borough Hall
- All items <u>MUST</u> be empty & rinsed <u>Single Stream- ALL</u> recyclable material goes together in one can- glass containers, aluminum, steel & aerosol cans (empty), plastic (#1, #2 & #5), newspapers, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, school/office papers & corrugated cardboard

NO ceramics, mirrors, light bulbs, plastic buckets or bags, greasy pizza boxes, paper or plastic cups, waxed cardboard, paper towels, tissues, paper milk or juice cartons, drink boxes, straws, plastic or metal coat hangers, dishes & cookware, ice cream or frozen juice cartons, plastic 6-pack holders, drinking glasses, window glass, hardback books, foam/peanut packaging, Styrofoam, plant trays, waxed paper, Tyvek envelopes



No greater than 4" in diameter, <u>MUST</u> be tied in bundles no larger than 2' x 4'. Brush <u>will not</u> be picked up unless it is put out properly!



We do not have leaf pick-ups. Leaves include leaves & pine needles ONLY. They can be put in the garbage or taken to the Southern Ocean Recycling Center in Manahawkin.

## <u>Tires</u> **U**

Residents can take standard car & truck tires to the Ocean County Recycling Center in Manahawkin

- Tires must be off the rim, in one piece & clean of all water, dirt & debris
  - There is a charge of \$2 per tire & there is a maximum of 5 tires per day

ONLY for residents- no commercial businesses!

# BULK ITEMS

Bulk items such as furniture and mattresses are picked up on regular trash days through the year

#### ELECTRONICS



Due to circumstances beyond our control, we cannot pick up electronics at the curb. TVs, computers, monitors & laptops cannot go in the garbage. These items must be taken to the Recycling Center in Manahawkin.

## CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS

Reminder-Construction debris (interior/exterior) generated by a contractor MUST be removed by the homeowner or contractor Other materials must be put out neatly & in manageable amounts. Wood must be bundled & tied and no longer than 4 ft. in length. If there is an excessive amount, you must get a dumpster.



### REFRIGERATORS & AIR CONDITIONERS



These items contain Freon & cannot go in the landfill. Please come to Borough Hall to schedule a pick up for the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday. There is a \$20 fee for each item which must be paid prior to pick-up.



#### WHITE GOODS & METAL





Washers, dryers, stoves, hot water heaters, grills, bicycles, etc. are not picked up as bulk items. They will be picked up the last Wednesday of the month to be recycled. You MUST contact the Borough Hall to be put on the list for pick-up.



#### Rigid Plastic



Buckets, children's toys, lawn furniture, totes, 5-gallon water bottles, laundry baskets, milk crates, etc. should be taken to the Ocean County Recycling Center in Manahawkin.



#### Propane Tanks

Will <u>not</u> be picked up at the curb. They must be taken to a propane dealer or taken to a Household Hazardous Waste site in the Spring or Fall.

### MOTOR OIL



Can be brought to the Borough Yard, 8:00AM - 3:00PM weekdays. A receipt for \$2 for each gallon must first be obtained from Borough Hall.

## Hazardous Waste & Paper Shredding Events

Ocean County offers hazardous waste drop-off and paper shredding events in the spring & fall. For the schedule &/or to register go to www.county.ocean.nj.us/recycle

#### \*\*IMPORTANT\*\*
